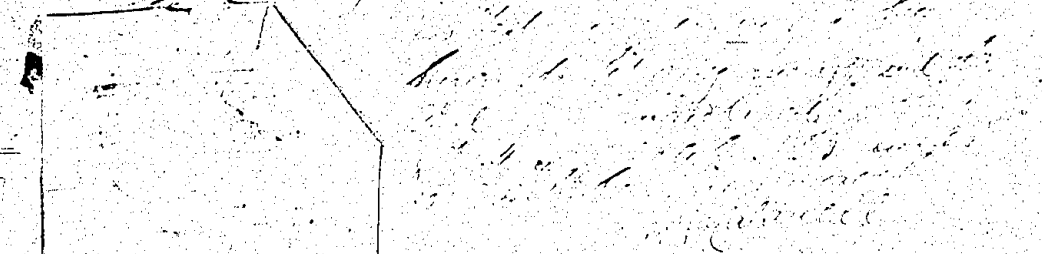

On this 18th day of November 1837 personally
appeared before me _____ a justice
of the peace for Russell County Sarah Saulsbury
a resident of the County of Russell State of
Kentucky who being first duly sworn accor-
-ding to law doth on her oath make the follow-
-ing declaration in order to obtain the benefit
of the provisions of an act of Congress passed July
4. 1836 -

That she is the widow of Augustine (alias)
Austin Saulsbury who was a private in the Regi-
ment of Col. Harrison in the army of the Revolu-
-tion. Her deceased husband was a pen-
-sioner and was inscribed on the pension list
Roll of the Kentucky Agency at the rate of eight
dollars per month on the 27th day of September
1828 as will more fully appear reference being
had to his pay certificate the original whereof
is herewith forwarded and for an account
of his services reference is had to his declaration
now on file in the War office

She further declares that she was lawfully
married to her said husband the said August-
tine (alias) Austin Laulep in the year 1831
and that her said husband died on the
19th day of October 1832 and that she has
remained a widow ever since that period
as will more fully appear by reference to the
proof hereto annexed - Sarah ^{her} Laulep
subscribed and sworn to before me this
18th Novr 1837 - Enoch Yantis, P.P.S.

married ever since her husband's death
that she must be at least 80 years of
age and the eldest son of the said Augustine
(alias) Austin and Sarah is now at least

The deposition of Jesse Lawless taken at his own house in Olmsted County Minn to be used as evidence in favor of the application of Sally Lawless for a pension

Deponent being fifty five years ^{old} the 26th day of October 1838 Depose & testify that he was well acquainted with Augustus alias Austin Lawless and Sally Lawless the deponent being their son. deponent further saith that he knew his father the aforesaid Austin Lawless was a pensioner on the roll of the Indian Army at the time of his death that his father the aforesaid Austin Lawless died on the nineteenth day of October Eighteen hundred and thirty two and that his mother the aforesaid Sally Lawless has remained a widow ever since the death of his father down to the present period Deponent further saith that he is the second child of austin & Sally Lawless that they first born son Augustus now named was born as it has been informed by his father & mother in the month of October Seven hundred and eighty two. The third child Sally Lawless now Polly States was born Seven hundred and eighty four in the month of October The fourth child Susanna Lawless now Susanna Hamilton was born in the month of December 1785 The fifth child Edward Lawless was born in the month of December 1786 The sixth child Nathan Lawless was born in the month of January 1788 The seventh child Thomas Lawless was born in January 1789 The eighth child William Lawless was born May 1790 The ninth child John Lawless was born in the month of June 1792 The tenth and last child James Lawless was born in the month of August 1794 The above date and ages of the above named Children has been handed down to him by his father and mother traditionally there having been no family register kept by them and the deponent has every reason to believe the above statement of the Children & their ages are correct and the deponent further saith not
