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Declarations of Charles Moore

State of Kentucky Adair County Town

On this 9th day of August 1839, personally appeared before the Justice of the County Court of Adair now sitting Charles Moore a resident of Adair County aged seventy-two years who, being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 -

That he entered the services of the United States under the following named officers and serves as herein stated -

That he volunteered in the year 17th under Capt. Patton and was at the battle of Guilford under the command of Genl McDowell ^{3 months} ~~of the~~ ^{which} battle he was called down to Petersburg Virginia, ^{under Capt. Gray} ~~the town~~ ^{where} ~~he~~ ^{was} ~~was~~ ^{about} 3 months after which he went out under Capt. Trimble under Genl Surveysor & fell in with Genl Mariani and was at the taking of 90 odd prisoners at Monticello Corner in North Carolina four months town. I had three discharges the first from Capt Patton the 2nd from Capt Trimble the 3rd from Capt Gray. The above named discharges are lost and it is completely out of my power to find them. He recollects the name of

Gen Stephens or Stephenson he has no docu-
-mentary evidence by which he is enabled to
prove his service. He knows of no persons
whose testimony he can procure, who can
testify to his services. He declares that his whole
service was about nine or ten months.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever
to a pension or annuity except the present, and
declares that his name is not on the pension
roll of the agency of any state, or (if any) only
on that of the agency of the state of Kentucky
sworn to, and subscribed, the day & year
aforesaid
