on this 10th day of August 1832 person
nally appeared in open Court before
The worshipful Justices of Adair
County Court now sitting Isaac
Staples a Rescinder of the County of
Adair of and State of Kentucky
age 70 years who being first duly
sworn according to Law doth on this
Oath make the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of
the act of Congress passed 7th June
1832 that he entered the service of
the United States in the Revolutionary
war under Capt John Chambers
in the month of January 1780 in the
County of Buckingham State of Virg
nia ^{as a drafted militia man} he was marched first to Prince
Edward Courthouse where he remained
a short time and from there he was
marched to Hillsborough North Caroli
na where he was joined to the Regm
ent commanded by Col^l Halcomb
and in a few days marched on
to Guilford where ^{he} ~~was~~ joined Genl
Greene and was with him at the
Battl^e of Guilford from there he
was marched to Warfords from Warf
from there to Virginia from thence
Back to Hillsborough where he rem
ained a short time & then returned

to York where he was Honorably discharged
and returned home, ~~making~~ Sea
Months Service - after some time
he again entered the Service as
of ^{as a volunteer in the militia} under Captain John Clark by whom
he was marched to Stannton where he
joined the Army commanded by Lord
Green and remained there until
he was Honorably discharged after
a Service of four months. Making
in the whole ten months Service
in the State that he by the misfor-
tune of getting his house burnt
some years ago his discharge was
consumed, he has no written Evidence
of his Service he knows of no living
witness by whom he can prove
his Services or any Part of them
he having many years ago moved to
the western Country and none
of his Companions in arms are
there nor within his reach or know-
ledge, he has lived but a short time here and has no in-
tellect he hereby Delinquents Every
claim whatever to a pension or
annuity except the present and
declares his name is not on the
Roll of the agency of any State

said County of Adair, and are credible persons
and that their statement is entitled to credit
