





What I know about Andy Jack

Family Tradition is that he was drafted into the Confederate Army, deserted (a common practice) and enlisted and served in Co. C, 1st TN Infantry Regiment (Union Army) from 15 Oct 1861 to Nov 1864. During the Battle of Cumberland Gap, his horse was shot and fell on him crippling him in both legs, causing him to walk with two canes. He was captured and held as a POW in Richmond, VA. When his son Thea, told him years later that he had settled in Clay Co, MO, he told Thea he knew where it was because he fought in the Battle of Lexington. After the war his job was to clear the riff-raff out of the hills of TN for the government. He was a very big man (not heavy, just tall). The book, <u>Tenting Tonight-A Soldier's</u> Story, lists the average height of a soldier during the Civil War as between 5'5" and 5'9", the tallest being 6'11". Judging from his photographs, I would estimate his height at 6'6". His favorite chair was specially made to accommodate his size.

He always carried two pistols (one you could see one you couldn't). He was implicated in but never arrested nor charged with the shooting of John Kincaid in Campbell Co, TN.

Andy Jack and Mattie migrated to Renfro Valley, Rockcastle, KY and their son Theodore was born there. When Thea was six or seven they migraged to Yosemite, Casey, KY, and it was there he purchased 350 acres of land in for \$50. This is still known as Bratcher Hollow and his descendants still live there. As of 1992, the original barn remained standing, but was gone by 2005. The grandson of of his daughter, Sallie Bastin owns the property today and it has a big lodge style house at the top of the mountain. This property is still called today "Bratcher Hollow" and the street that leads to it is Bratcher Hollow Road.
