place called Swains Canada in Richmond County Va. and
from there he was marched to the Rappahannock River and
remained there Stationed during the whole of his tour in
guarding the Swains and the public & private property in
that vicinity - that he was during this tour under the
command of Col. Henry Blagden. He states that he served
out his tour full and faithfully and at the termination
thereof was discharged and returned home.

He further states and declares that afterwards in the month
of July 1781 he was called to re-enlist in the
service of the United States as a private volunteer soldier upon a
tour of three months in the Company of Captain George Lee
and was immediately thereupon appointed an ordinary
sergeant of his said company by his said Captain and con-
tinued as such during his whole tour - that he rendezvoused with
his said company at Powhatan upon the Rappahannock
River in Richmond County Va. and was attacked to the leg-
ionment of Col. Carter from Swains Canada
to a place called the proflage in Gloucester
County at which place there were at the time a number of
troops and he and his company remained there till they
were joined by Gen. Washington and then the main Army
was marched to York and the detachment was marched
to Gloucester and was transferred to the command of Gen.
Meade - he states that he continued with the Army and did
active service during his whole tour and that his last
sawed about two days before the capture of York but
that he remained in the Army and witnessed the evacuation
and being discharged returned home.

He states that he has no accidents incurred and that
he knows of no persons whose testimony he can procure who
can testify to his service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatsoever to a pen-
sion or annuity except the present and declares that his
name is not on the pension roll of the Army of any other
war and subscribed the day & year aforesaid

Witness, John, late to the above named applicant by the late
Price, Marshall Justice of the peace as above named and member
of the Henry County Court.

Q. Where and in what year were you born?
Answer. I was born in Richmond County Virginia in the year 1763
according to my informant.

Q. Where in what year of your age were you called into
service? I have heard at this time of the service
where you were living when called into service, where have
you lived since the revolution was over where you were
born?

Answer. I was living in Richmond County Va. when I en-
tered the service. Where I lived some years and then moved to
Frederick County Va. and there continued till about 17 years
ago and then moved to the place where I have continued to
reside ever since and now live in Henry County Va.

Q. How were you called into the service, were you drafted,
or were you a volunteer, or were you a substitute, and if a sub-
stitute for whom?

Answer. Upon some time of my term I was drafted and
upon the others I was a volunteer. I was in the ranks of some of the officers who were with
the troops where you served such continental or militia
regiments as you can recollect, and the general circum-
stances of your service.

Answer. I recollect to have seen such and such Major
Cary who were regular officers, Capt. Peck, Lt. Black &
Major Redman whose names I now remember, there is a great
number of others whose names I have forgotten with whom
I was acquainted. My services upon my term were di-
rected to the coast of the river and they principally
were intended to protect the country from the incursions
and depredations of the British. I served upon my term
at the Gloucester when the British was beaten
at York and finally captured.

Q. Did you ever return to the army from the service
and if so where was it of your service and what was the result of it?

Answer. I have received that our brother, George and
that was signed by my Captains, and has been received
of the State the names of persons to whom you are known in
your present neighbourhood and who can testify as to your
Character for veracity and their belief of your services as a
Soldier of the Revolution

Answer. I will name Price Nuttall and Jack Johnson
as persons to whom I am known
