On this 1st day of September one thousand eight hundred
 & fifty three personally appeared before me John G. Taylor
 Judge of the County of Henry in the State of Kentucky
 Mrs. Mary Lippie a resident of the County of Henry &
 State of Kentucky aged 52 years who being duly sworn
 according to Law doth on her oath make the following
 Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions
 made by act of Legislature passed 29th day of July 1848 the
 State that she is the widow of William Lippie who was
 a Soldier in the Army of the Revolution he was dragged
 in the Virginia Line that he drew a pension at the
 rate of one hundred dollars a year that his Order
 there is made as per the pension office at
 the City of Washington to which she refers you for his
 Service that he was paid in the year 1812
 on the 22nd day of December one thousand eight
 hundred & twenty nine that he is the identical William
 Lippie named in his original Certificate herewith presented
 She further declares she was married to the said
 William Lippie on the 4th day of March 1792 by one
 James Harrison a Justice of the Peace in the State
 of South Carolina & her husband that her husband
 died the said William Lippie died in the County of
 Henry & State of Kentucky on the 30th day of May
 1808 she states that she was married to him after
 he left the service & before the year 1800 and at the
 time above stated she further states that she is now
 a widow that she sent a declaration for a pension
 last winter which was deferred not being in
 favor of the Legislature for pensions she further states that
 she has no written evidence of her marriage that she
 has written to South Carolina but could not obtain
 any proof in writing

She further states that she will give you the portrait of
Leper Currell who was present at her marriage to
William Jeffers, the only person now living who
knew her married. She also states that she will
give you the cordons of hair of her daughters
who have been her for a number of years past
and the record of her children's ages & the only record she
can produce of her being William Jeffers, wife
Mary Jeffers

personally known to me and is very old & infirm & unable
to attend court which has caused me to take the
above declaration at the house of the said Mary
Jeffers living in the County of Henry & I do

That her husband volunteered at
_____ on or about the day of A.D.
for the term of _____ and continued
in actual service in said War for
the term of at least fifteen days.
She further states that she was married to
the said William Jeffries in Spotsylvania
County S. Carolina on the 20th day of May A.D.
by one Isham Houston a ^{Justice of the Peace} ~~Justice of the Peace~~ and that her
name before her said marriage was Nancy
Connell. That her said husband died
at Home on the 30th day of May A.D. 1858
and she is now a widow at the date
of executing this her declaration.
and she further declares that she was
pensioned under the act of the 27th day of
May February 1854 at the rate of one hundred

dollars per annum that her pension
 Certificate is dated the 24th day of March
 A.D. 1864, No. 6230. She refers to a declaration
 made on file for evidence of her
 husband's death and her marriage. &
 she makes this declaration for the purpose
 of obtaining the bounty land to which
 she may be entitled under the act
 approved March 3rd 1863. She also
 declares that she never has received
 nor applied for bounty land
 under this nor any other act of
 Congress. I do direct my bounty to go
 to Sparks of Pleasenville Ky. 3 Nancy ^{not} Jeffries
 sworn to and subscribed before the day
 and year above written and I certify
 that I believe the claimant to be the
 identical person that she represents
 herself to be and that I have no
 interest in said claim. the word Virginia
 was placed and the word Carolina and
 a justice of the peace was inserted.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act of Congress entitled "An act for the relief of certain survivors officers and soldiers of the army of the revolution" approved on the 15th day of May 1828 I William Jeffris of Henry County in the State of Kentucky do hereby declare that I entered in the Continental line of the army of the revolution for and during the war, and continued in its service until its termination, at which period I was a private in Captain John Watts company in the first Virginia regiment of cavalry of the Virginia line and I also declare that I afterwards received certificate for the reward of eighty dollars; to which I was entitled, under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th day of May 1778 -

And I further declare, that I was not on the 15th day of May 1828 on the pension list of the United States Witness my hand this 30th day of October in the year 1829 William Jeffris
