On the 30 day of December 1833 personally  
appeared before me David Adams a Justice of the Peace  
in and for Humphreys and one of the Judges of the County  
Court for said County of Henry Isaac Lewis aged 73 years  
who being first duly sworn according to Law doth  
on his oath make the following declaration in order to  
obtain the benefit of an act of Congress passed the 7th  
of June 1832

This deponent states that he was residing in  
Orange County State of New York when he entered  
the service of the United and Land under the fol-  
-lowing named officers he states that some time in the  
summer of the year 1776 he enlisted for a period of  
twelve months he enlisted under one James Boyle a non-  
-commissioned officer and was commanded by Capt  
William Blair he states that the company under  
at Goshen in Orange County State of New York  
and under the command of Capt Blair he  
states that he marched to Albany where he states  
he remained but for a short period he was then  
marched to the Frontiers under the command of Capt Blair  
for the purpose of protecting the exposed parts of the  
State of upholding the Indians and British from our  
Frontiers he states that after spending some time upon the  
Frontiers the company to which he was attached  
was ordered to march to Saratoga to unite

wrote the American Army that had come from  
Quebec the States that then they were put under the  
Command of General Stark and remained with  
them until after the surrender of Burgoyne the State  
that he was appointed guarding prisoners taken from  
Burgoyne as far as York when this letter was written  
for which he had instead captured and was  
discharged. He further states that some time in the  
month of June or July which he does not recollect the  
volunteers for a term of three months were capt-  
3 ained some and Lieutenant Peter Doyle the States  
they marched from the vicinity of Orange  
County to Sachawanna Creek in the frontiers  
then we were met by a tribe of Indians com-  
-manded by a Capt. Brown in the fore of the  
Creek Sachawanna a disastrous engagement  
ensued in which my officer was killed except  
a Capt. John Wood who was taken prisoner and  
kept by the Indians for five years and after this  
disastrous defeat I returned to Orange County  
in New York - after which I was employed  
a great part of the war in guarding the frontiers in  
scouting and spring patrols until the year of 1781  
but how long I was actually employed in the

but how long I was actually employed in the  
service of the United States he does not actually  
recollect the date that he has no recollection in mind  
of his name and knows of no living witness by whom he  
can prove said service he has by all possible means  
whatsoever to a person a surname except the general and  
vague that his name is not on the pension roll of the  
agency of any state

where I lived till the year of 1803 I then moved  
to Henry County Kentucky where I have lived  
ever since

Ques How was you called into the service were  
you drafted did you volunteer or were you  
a substitute and of a substitute for whom

ans. I first enlisted for six days months I then  
volunteered for three months I then was employed

in peering and spying on the frontier for  
a considerable time

the said department and investigating the matter  
I am satisfied that he was a soldier of the  
revolution and served as the high station in his  
declaration
