After staying home some time, he again in the
months of August 1778 - Volunteered and
entered the service in the said month of Aug 1778
that he entered the service as a private for three months &
served three months as a private in the Virginia
militia - that he entered the service under Capt.
Gerald or Fitzgerald Col Jones & Genl Washington
- that he started from the same place & proceeded to
Petersburg in Virginia & was stationed there and
remained there until Nov 1778
at which time & place he was discharged by his
Captains

that he was in no battle - that he was born
on the 1st day of October 1750 - that he has a record
of his age - which he took from his father Belle
which he has both know his name -

that since the revolutionary war he has resided part of
his time Georgia & S. Carolina & for the last fifteen years
he has lived in King county where he now lives -
that he is well known in his neighborhood to Alex.
Demms & Thomas Batts who can testify

to his character for veracity & them believe of his
services in the war of the revolution - that there is
no clergyman residing in his neighborhood - that
the above named Alex Demms & Thomas Batts

are citizens of King county & reside in his neighbor-
hood - that he has no documentary evidence of
his service & knows of no person whose testimony
he can procure, who can testify to his services -
he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a
pension or annuity except the present & declares
that his name is not on the pension Roll of
the agency of any state - sworn to & subscribed
this day & year above said

residing in the said county of Henry & State Kentucky
& in the neighborhood of the said Richard Maynard
who has subscribed & sworn to the above declaration
and that from our acquaintance with him
we believe him to be of the age of 82 years

he is reputed & believed in this neighborhood
when he resides to have been a soldier of
the revolution - & that we concur in that opinion
- & that no clergyman resides in the immediate
vicinity of the said Maynard - sworn to & subscribed

On this 3^d day of December 1832. came hereto
Court (being a Court of record) Richard Maynard and produced
and filed hereto Court his declaration for a pension under
the act of Congress 1832. to which he was sworn, and the
Court hereby declare their opinion after the investigation
of the matter and after putting the interrogatories presented
by the war department that the above named applicant
was a revolutionary soldier and served as he states, and the
Court further certifies that it appears to them that Alexan-
-der Dunn and Thomas Batts who have signed the preceding
certificate are residents of the County of Henry and that
their statement is entitled to credit.
