Ilis lette - neturned Reference is made to your letter addressed to
The Ene Adjutant General, War Department, this city,
in which you state that you are interested in a
John Mead, who was been October 32, 1985, married
Elizabeth Van Buren. Married that she
died October 11, 1887, and as died by 17, 1833. You
cite John Mead who served in Dutchess County, Hew
York militia, War of the Revolution, and wish to
know whether he was born on the date given above.

The Resolutionary War records of this office have been searched and no claim for pension found based upon the service of a John Mead who was born October 23, 1785, and served with the New York troops.

Towners furnished herein the Revolutionary War record of a John Meed, as found in papers on file in pension claim, 8. 56125, based upon his service in that war. It is hoped that this record will be of interest to you.

The date and place of birth of John Mead were not given, nor were the names of his parents stated.

John Mead emlisted in Finchester, Virginia, scretime in July, 1775, served in Captain Daniel Horgan's Virginia company, marched to Quebec under General Arnold, was in the battle of Quebec, there captured, shortly afterwards was paroled, and returned to Frederick County, Virginia. He emlisted December 25, 1776, served as private in Captains Peter Bruin's and Charles Portarfield's companies in Colonel Daniel Morgan's lith Virginia regiment; he was in the battle of Brandywine, at the taking of Burgoyne, in an engagement at White Plains, in the battles of Edgehill, Monmouth, Stony Point, and at the taking of Cornwallis, and was discharged sometime in December, 1781.

The soldier, John Head, was allowed pension on his application executed November 6, 1818, at which time he was about sixty-four years of age, and living in Henry County, Kentucky.

He referred in 1821 to two children, a son and a daughter; the son had a wife and five children, and the daughter was married to — Wilson, who had five children. The names of son and daughter, and children were not shown, nor was the name of the wife of the soldier given.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, name and address of person paid, and possibly the date of death of this pensioner, you should apply to The Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D.C., and furnish the following data—
