District of Kentucky set

On this 21st of Aug. 1820 personally appeared in open Court being the County Court of Garrard in S. District Richard Powell age about fifty two years Resident in Garrard County in S. District, who being sworn duly sworn according to law swore on his oath declared that he served with Revolutionary war as follows - He enlisted in 1767 with Capt. John Spotswood with Collyer a Regt. command Col Greene, for three years on continental establishment and served his term and an old man with his charge which he has lost -

And I do solemnly swear that I was a member of the Militia of the State on the 18th of March 1818, and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any other manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish the same being engaged within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled an Act to be passed for certain purposes engaged in the said said Naval Service of the Militia of the State in the Revolutionary War as professed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in this schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed

One mare worth forty Dollars and no more - and two cows worth twenty Dollars and no more - making in all \$60 but he owes that much or more to his heirs. His Occupation Agriculture - a wife aged 63 years living with him - He has five Children - but they are all doing for themselves and not under his control.

The affidavit of
Levi Scott taken in Henry County Kentucky
on the 13th day of July 1839

This affiant who
being first duly sworn according to law doth
on his oath make the following statements
That he is now about seventy two years
of age and that he is a brother of
Sarah Powell widow of Richard Powell
who was reputed to have been a ^{Pensioner} ~~soldier~~
of the revolution - This affiant will state
that he formerly lived in North Carolina
that he removed to Kentucky about the
year 1781 - he will further state that his
sister Sarah Powell was married in South
Carolina ^{as he was informed & believed.} that about eight or nine years
after this affiant moved to Kentucky
he understood from another sister
that came out to Kentucky that his
sister Sarah had married a man
by the name of Powell - This affiant
will state that he never saw the said
Powell until his sister and the said
Powell moved to Kentucky which
was about somewhere between twenty
five and thirty years ago according to
this affiant's best recollection
and further this affiant sayeth not

On this 20th day of
September 1838 personally appeared before A D
Johnson a Justice of the peace in and for
Henry County Kentucky Sarah Powell a resident
of Kentucky in the County of Henry aged eighty
years who being first duly sworn according to law
doth in her oath make the following declaration
in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made
by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838
entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions
to certain widows"

That she is the widow of
Richard Powell who was a private in the
army of the revolution in the regular service.
this declarant will not however undertake to
state the particulars of the service of her husband
the said Richard Powell as he drew a
pension of Twenty six dollars per annum
before his death she will refer the depart-
ment to his declaration which was made under
the act of Congress of 1818 as she believes
that her husband died before the act of 1828
She further declares that she was married to the
said Richard Powell on the 25 day of

April in the year Seventeen hundred
and Eighty eight or nine according to the ages of
her children and her best recollection in Greenville
district or county South Carolina that her husband the afore-
said Richard Powell died on the 29th day of
July — in the year Eighteen hundred and
twenty five — that she was not married to him
prior to his leaving the service but the marriage
took place previous to the first of January
Seventeen hundred and ninety four viz — at the
time above stated — She would further state that
she has no family record of her marriage with
the said Richard Powell — that she was
married in the county aforesaid by _____
Blackburn and that she is very certain she was
married some years before 1794 that her eldest
son is still living that he is now 49 years of age
the declarant will further state that from her
old age and infirmity of ^{her} body she is unable
to attend in open court to make her declara-
tion that the small amount which her husband
drew will be of great use and benefit to her in
her old age —

oath make the following statements
That he is the son

of Richard Powell and Sarah his wife - that according to the best of his knowledge and belief he was born in the year Seventeen hundred and eighty nine in Greenville South Carolina that his father and mother moved to Kentucky about the year 1810 that his father died in 1825 that he drew a pension of \$96 = dollars for some years before his death that his mother Sarah Powell is still living and has remained a widow ever since the death of her husband the said Richard Powell.
