It is shown that on the 31st day of May 1853 personally appeared before the undersigned Justice of the Peace in and for said County of Henry, Scotland, and one of the Justices of the Peace County of Henry, one Scotland, a resident of the said County of Henry, he aged 88 years who being found duly sworn a citizen by law doth upon his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 4th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officer and served as herein stated - that is to say having removed from Charles County Maryland where he resided to the County of Loudoun in the State of Virginia he did in the month of July in the year 1777, as well as he ~~remembers~~ remembers enter the service of the United States as a private soldier and attached militia man upon a term of three months in the Company of Capt. Ricketts that he surrendered with his Company at the Court House in Loudoun County as was he then held but was attached to the Regiment of Col. ~~Strom~~ Pendleton that he was marched from there to New Green and as that State joined the main Army under Genl. Washington that he combined with the Army during the whole service of his term that during the time of his term the Battle of Brandywine was fought that he was not amongst the troops which were actually engaged in fighting - that soon after the Battle took place of the City of Philadelphia his term of service expired and he was discharged and returned home.

He further states and declares that in the month of September 1780 he did re-engage as a private in the service of the United States as a drafted militia man and private soldier upon a term of three months in the Company of Capt. ~~Strom~~ ~~Strom~~ that he again surrendered with the Company at the Court House in Loudoun County where he still resided and that he was then attached to a Regiment under the Command of Col. ~~Strom~~ and was attached from there to Fredericksburg Virginia where he was kept stationed

during the whole of his time as a ~~private~~ part of the
guard of that place and guard for the public stores
during the whole of his time and at the termination
thereof he was discharged and returned home

The declarant states and declares that in the month
of Sept 1781 as well as he remembers he again joined
the service of the United States as a drafted militia man
and a private soldier upon a tour of three months in the
Company of Captains Becken that he again volunteered
with his Company at the Courthouse in Culpeper Court
va where he was needed and he was there attached
to the regiment of Col. Stevens. He states that he was
marched from his said place of residence to their
encampment at ~~the~~ where he remained some time and a day
then marched and joined the main Army under the
Command of Gen Washington which they marched
to York and the siege of the British Army at that
place under the Command of Cornwallis terminated
and this declaration was printed and affixed in the
prospect of the said siege and was printed at the
surrender of the British Army this declarant further
states that soon after the surrender of the British his
term of service expired and having fully & faithfully
performed his tour of three months he was discharged
and returned home

This declarant further states that he has no document
any evidence and that he knows of no person to
whom he can now procure such evidence to his
view except his daughter Mrs. Johnson with whom
he now lives

He hereby ratifies every claim written to a pen
ion or award except the present and declares that
his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any
State

1st Where and in what year were you born?

Answer I was born in Charles County Maryland in 1745

2^d Have you any record of your age & if so where is it?
Answer I have none at this time, cannot find it

3^d What were your terms when called into service where
have you lived since the revolution was over where
do you now live?

Answer I lived in Calpoper Va until it was
called into the service and then continued to live here
about the year 1788 and then moved to Shilby County
Ky. where I continued to live till a little more than
two months ago when I moved to Shelby County Ky
where I now live

4th How were you called into service, were you draft-
ed, did you volunteer or were you a substitute and
if a substitute for whom?

Answer I was drafted

5th State the names of some of the regular officers who
were with the troops when you served such continue
ed and military minutia as you can recollect and
the general circumstances of your service

Answer - My memory was he failed me from lapses of
time and my advanced age that I have forgotten
the names of most of the officers when I lived but
I recollect Genl Washington, Lt Col Mearns, Major of the
1st Va and Lawson and Miller and Col Spivey
-ton Horn and several others upon my first being
I was with the main Army under Genl Washington
and was with it when the Battle of Brandywine
was fought though I was not personally engaged
in it - Upon my second tour I was stationed
at Fredericktown Va - Upon my third tour I was with
the main Army at the Siege of Fort Mifflin

6th How and where were you discharged from the service
of 80 1/2 years was it given and what by name of it
Answer I received discharge & was by the officers, what
I have lost

I'll state the names of persons to whom you wish
to give credit & neighborhood and who can testify as
to your character for veracity and that belief of your
services as a soldier of the Revolution.

Answer I will name Thomas Nelson of Harrison Nelson
& Thomas Brauner
who have subscribed the day & year aforesaid

The Thomas Brauner a clergyman residing in Wayne
County Kentucky and Thomas Nelson, residing in the
same County and state hereby certify that we are well
acquainted with Francis Wheatland who has taken
and sworn to the above declaration that we
believe him to be 88 years of age, that he is respected
and believed in the neighborhood where he resides
to have been a soldier of the Revolution and that we
concur in that opinion.

And I Wm. McCracken Justice of the Peace and
member of the Wayne County Court as aforesaid hereby
declare my opinion after the investigation of the matter
and after perusing the interrogatories prescribed by the
War Department that the above named applicant
was a Revolutionary Soldier and served as he stated
and I further certify that the Th. Brauner who has sub-
scribed and sworn to the preceding certificate is a
clergyman residing in Wayne County Ky. and that Thomas
Nelson who has also subscribed and sworn to the
same is a resident of the same County & state and
that they are credible persons and that their state-
ments are entitled to credit and I also certify that
the said applicant from bodily infirmity cannot attend
Court to make his declaration.

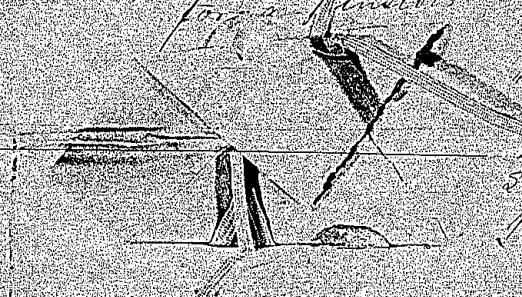

The deposition of Nancy Wilson taken at her house
in Henry County Va on the 31st day of Decr 1833 to be
used on the part of Francis Sutherland who is about
making an application to be placed on the Pension
Roll of the United States as a claim of the Revolutionary
War dependent being first set down according to
law upon his oath that he is a son of the said
deponent of the said Francis Sutherland who now
lives at his house and who has this day made his
oath to obtain a pension. She states that
she is now 63 ^{not less} years of age and that she was a female
and during the revolutionary war but she distinctly
recollects that her father the said Francis Sutherland
served not less than three years of duty in the army
during that war and when he so served the party
lived in ~~North~~ paper County Va. She states that she does
not remember the length of his service nor the particular
period of the war in which they were performed
but from her present best recollections she is satisfied
that he did not serve less than nine months including
the whole of his service & perhaps much more. She
states that her said father from bodily infirmity is
not able to attend court.

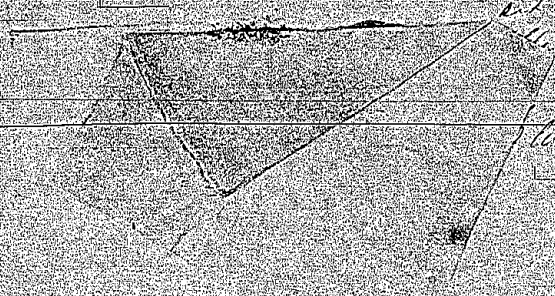
