Cermy Excise April Term 1821.

The following declaration I should I was filed  
in Court and Order be be entered on the record  
book. <sup>Lechone</sup> Fourth Judicial District of Kentucky  
Henry County Geo. On this third day of April in  
the year 1821 Personally appeared in Open Court  
(Cermy a Court of record, proceeding according to the course  
of the common law, and having proved of fine &  
imprisonment) David Taylor aged 63 years  
resident in Henry County in said District, who being  
first duly sworn according to their oath on his oath  
declared, that he served in the Revolutionary War  
as follows. That he shrites in February 1776 in  
Augusta County Virginia he enlisted as a private  
in Capt. Hayses Company of the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment,  
commanded by Colo. Fleming & Lieut. Colo. Matthews,  
his enlistment was for one year & shortly after his  
enlistment, he was taken from the lines, & placed in  
the Wagon department - The date of his Original  
declaration (he shrites) was in August 1819. He  
has received a Pension under said declaration, that  
drawn two installments up to the 4<sup>th</sup> March  
1820. He was placed on the Pension list under  
the law passed 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818, by Certificate bearing  
date 12<sup>th</sup> June 1820 at 17488. And I do solemnly  
swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United  
States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818, and that I  
have not since that time by gift, favor or in  
any manner disposed of my property or any  
part thereof with intent thereby to diminish

it so as to bring myself within the provisions of  
 an Act of Congress entitled 'An Act to provide for  
 certain Persons engaged in the Land & Naval Service  
 of the United States during the Revolutionary War  
 passed the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818. And that I have not  
 now nor have any person for me any property or securities  
 or contracts or debts due me - neither of any  
 income other than what is contained in the schedule  
 hereto annexed. And by me subscribed. All of which  
 that he Deposes holds the following Property

One Horse	\$40.00
One Cow	15.00
One Ill yoke Oxen One Ox and Hells and driving tools	32.00
Half set of saddle and boots	8.00

He states that he has ten children all of whom  
 accept one and married, and live in different parts of the  
 United States, the one that lives with him is a son of whom  
 his infirmity has been in a diseased state & one incumbered  
 is wholly incapable of labor thus no estate & aged  
 about thirty one years - The wife of this <sup>(Petitioner)</sup> ~~son~~  
 is 70 years old, has been afflicted many years & can  
 afford no assistance towards the support of this  
 Petitioner. Now Petitioner is a Quaker by trade but from  
 his age and infirmity is entirely incapable of supporting  
 himself and his circumstances are so meagre as to  
 require for his support the assistance of his Government  
 David Taylor

Madam:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 36824, it appears that David Taylor enlisted at Staunton, Augusta County, Virginia, in February, 1776 and served until December, 1777.

He was allowed pension from April 17, 1818, at which time he resided in Henry County, Kentucky. In 1824, he moved to Jefferson County, Indiana, and in 1825, his pension was made payable there.

In order to obtain the date of the last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid and possibly the date of death of the Revolutionary War soldier, David Taylor (S. 36824), you should apply to the General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D.C., citing all of the following data:

David Taylor, Certificate No. 17488, issued June 12, 1920, commenced April 17, 1818, rate \$8.00 per month, Act of March 18, 1818, Indiana Agency.
