The date of Thomas' death is a guess based on the settlement of his estate. The final court appearance by the administrator of the estate was in May of 1897. We can't get his death date from his tombstone, nearly all of his tombstone has been destroyed by cattle and weather. Thomas was a stone mason but for some reason his tombstone was made out of molded concrete. Kentucky did not begin keeping death records until 1911. Unless there's a family bible out there somewhere with his death recorded in it we may never know exactly when Thomas died

He married Rhoda Lane, also a native of Claiborne County, Tenn., and they were the parents of six children, viz: James L., William P., Sarah J., K.B., Maggie T. and Robert C. James L. White was reared on the farm and educated in his native county. In 1874 he moved to Rockcastle County and devoted his time to agricultural pursuits until 1881, when he was appointed sheriff of Rockcastle County by H. H. Baker, in which capacity he served until January, 1887. In August, 1886, he was elected sheriff of the county and assumed the duties of that office January 1, 1887. Selling out to Geo. Livesay he with James L. White opened up a store in the store house formerly owned by J.T. Clark. Mr White came here some years since from Lincoln county was appointed deputy sheriff under H.H. Baker, which office he filled satisfactorly and at the August election of 1886 was elected to the office of sheriff of this county. The new firm was not long under headway before they had worked up a good business and today they have a big slice of the trade that comes to this place. Besides carrying a full line of dry goods, notions, boots an shoes, ladies cloaks, hats, caps, clothing, tinware,

crockery, hardware, table cuterly, glassware, cigars, tobacco, harness, saddlery, nails, horse shoes &c., they handle agricultural implements such as chilled plows, hoes, rakes, Johnson's mowing machines, wagons, and the celebrated empire grain drills also, tilling for flues and salt by the car load. BIG FIRE!

\$15,000 Goes Up in Smoke

Fire broke out in the rear portion of the old Jack Adams store at Wednesday night. When discovered it had made such headway it was impossible to control it. The fire eat its way from where it started to Williams drug store, destroying M.J. Millers werehouse and store, Mrs Ella Baker's millinery store, residence and post office and Williams drug store. Most to the contents of the stores were saved. The mails and fixtures were saved from postoffice. Loss about \$10,000.

It was only by three hours hard work that the fire was gotten under control at Williams drug store.

The origin of the fire is thought to have been incerdinary.

Everyone in the place rendered assistance even to the women. Quite a number of citizens came in from the county. Judge Alcorn was in the thickest of the fight. Tom Johnson, Perry White and Bob Blackwell, the latter colored, deserve especial mention for their brave work. The town reminds one of Sherman's march to the sea. The colored troops fought bravely. Perry and J.I. White, S.C. Franklin, others have our thanks for helping to save the Signal office. The Miller hotel, Scott's store and Kate Moore's store and residence barely escaped. Little three year old claud Griffin came out of jail residence with a corset under his arm. Our people are the best fire fighters in the world. The L& N sent section men form Livingston, Pine Hill and other points what did good work.

JAMES E. WHITE DEAD RESULT OF OPERATION

Deceased Was Yard Master For the Espee In Tucson

James G. White, an employee of the Southern Pacific died yesterday morning at the St. Mary's hospital. White was operated on for appendicitis a short time ago and seemed (sic) to be recovering nicely, when he suffered a relapse.

The deceased has been employed in the yards of the Southern Pacific in this city for several years, coming here in 1909. He had previously worked for the L. and N. in Kentucky and the M. K. and T. He has two sisters and two brothers residing in this city. Relatives in the east have been telegraphed and an answer is awaited from them. The deceased was born at Mount Vernon, Ken., in 1882.

His death came as a great surprise to many friends. On account of his service in the yards at Tucson as a switchman first and then yard master he had gained many friends. The body is at a local undertaking parlor waiting instructions from relatives in the east.

Gradye Drown dies at 91; placed historic phone call

Gradye Drown, the telephone operator who placed Tucson's first long distance call 75 years ago, died Tuesday from complications from a stroke at her home in Middletown, N.J. She was 91.

Drown was born in Preachersville, Ken., in 1895. She came to Tucson with her family in 1903.

In 1910, when she was 15, she went to Los Angeles to learn to operate a telephone switchboard. When she returned, she worked as one of Tucson's four telephone operators at the time.

In June 1911, she placed the city's first long distance call, to Los Angeles, for cattleman Banning Vail. The call took several days to arrange cost Vail \$25.

"We first called Red Rock, then Casa Grande, then Yuma, then El Centro and on to Los Angeles," Drown said in an interview with The Arizona Daily Star in 1958. "If we hit a busy line we would have to start all over again."

She said it was difficult to hear the call because all along the line other operators were listening to make sure

the call went through.

Drown worked for Mountain States Telephone Co. until she retired in 1960.

After living in Tucson for 81 years, Drown moved to Middletown in 1984 to live with the family of the niece she raised.

Drown is survived by her niece, Joanne H. Perkins of Middletown, N.J., and by dozens of other nieces, nephews, and grandnieces and grandnephews.

A memorial service is scheduled for 11 a.m. Monday at Evergreen Mortuary, 3015 N. Oracle Road.

Lenna H. Burges Taken In Death

Mrs. Lenna King Hobbs Burges, a Tucsonan since 1903, noted for her skill as a stenographer and court reporter, and long prominent in Tucson courts and Democratic politics, died yesterday morning. She was 77 years old.

Suffering from cancer, her health had faded in recent months.

Since 1940, Mrs. Burges had been the personal secretary of William R. Mathews, editor and publisher of the Arizona Daily Star, although she preferred to be referred to as a stenographer.

Mrs. Burges died in bed at her home at 518 E. 1st St. in the presence of her two daughters and three sons.

The erect, forthright Mrs. Burges for many years prepared and edited the "In Old Tucson" column which appears on the Star's editorial page seven days a week. She frequently flavored the column with personal comments initialed "L.H.B." She had prepared a supply of columns in advance which will continue to run in the Star.

Just last night Mrs. Burges was to receive a Certificate of Award and an Honorary Life Membership in the Tucson YWCA for 40 years of devoted service to that organization.

Because of her illness, a son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Tom King Burges, of Tucson, were to receive the certificate and a letter praising her YWCA work for her.

At the annual YWCA banquet last night, high tributes were paid posthumously to Mrs. Burges and there was a moment of silence in her memory. Throughout the years, Mrs. Burges held several offices in the Y and headed numerous of its committees.

Mathews yesterday referred to Mrs. Burges as his "secretary emeritus."

The Star editor and publisher said, "She was extremely valuable to us because she knew so much about Tucson and the people who had lived here 50 years or more. The newsroom had always found her a source of information and help. She liked the companionship of the active newsroom of a morning paper.

"As recently as a month ago she was giving directions about the Star's daily publication. She worked until last May when she went to the hospital for an operation. She handled all of my correspondence all of those years. She was very rugged and always seemed to enjoy working. She never lost her love for politics. I found her suggestions of great value."

Mathews praised the "high standard of excellence of her work." He said he will write an article within a few days "about the colorful experiences of having her as my secretary." He said he particularly appreciated her "kindly frank" personality.

A few years ago Mrs. Burges gave up some of her secretarial duties at the Star, but she couldn't remain idle, so she became a secretary for Harry Ackerman while he was serving in the Arizona Legislature, and when he became county attorney she continued as a part-time employe in his office.

Mrs. Burges was born in Lincoln County, Ky. She was educated at Stanford Female College, Stanford, Ky., and at Midway School for Girls, Lexington, Ky. At 17, she was Kentucky's first female court reporter. She worked in law offices in Kentucky, New Mexico and Arizona.

After moving here, she was secretary to merchant Albert Steinfeld and then for County Attys. George R. Darnell, Louis Kempf and K. Berry Peterson. She served as clerk of the Pima County Superior Court from January, 1927,

to January, 1939.

In 1906 she married Howard Benjamin Burges of Houston who was a Southern Pacific conductor until his death in 1925.

After coming to Tucson, Mr. and Mrs. Burges first lived in a home at 250 N. Stone Ave., now the site of First National Bank's downtown office. Until recently, Mrs. Burges drove her car to town and parked on First National's lot where her rose bushes and fruit trees once grew.

She recalled recently that she used to attend ice cream socials on the lawn of the Methodist parsonage – where the Pioneer Hotel now stands.

When Mrs. Burges came to Tucson at the age of 19, she weighed 89 pounds and reported to work in floor-length woolen skirts, long-sleeved shirtwaist with high collar, high button shoes and several petticoats.

Mrs. Burges was a charter member of the Order of Railway Conductors Auxiliary, Tucson Garden Club, Tucson Business and Professional Women's Club, of which she was a past president, and of the YWCA.

She was honored with a life membership in the National Assn. of Retired and Veteran Railway Employees in 1955.

Also, she was a member of the Grace Episcopal Church, the National Shorthand Reporters Assn., State Assn. of Reporters, Rebekah and Eastern Star chapters and the Brotherhood of Railroad Firemen and Enginemen.

In 1928-30, she was president of the Arizona Congress of Parents and Teachers. She was a past president of the Arizona State Federation of Democratic Women's Clubs and was a member of the Alpha Phi Mothers Club.

She traveled widely and had a book collection of several thousand volumes.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. J. P. Fraps, Tucson, and Mrs. G. B. Rysdale, Balboa, Calif.; three sons, Tom King Burges, Tucson; Howard Benjamin Burges, Fullerton, Calif., and Sterrett Burges, Pleasant Hill, Calif.; a brother and two sisters, W. T. Hobbs, Mrs. C. W. Littlefield and Mrs. Gradye Drown, all of Tucson, and 14 grandchildren.

Services will be conducted at 4 p.m. tomorrow at Grace Episcopal Church. Revs. Howard Blackburn and Jerry Wallace will officiate. Kerr Mortuary is in charge of arrangements. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery.

REMARKS:

SYNOPSIS: When nuclear powered USS ENTERPRISE arrived on Yankee Station on December 2, 1965, she was the largest warship ever built. She brought not only an imposing physical presence, but also an impressive component of warplanes and the newest technology. By the end of her first week of combat operations, the ENTERPRISE had set a record of 165 combat sorties in a single day. By the end of her first combat cruise, her air wing had flown over 13,000 combat sorties. The record had not been achieved without cost.

One of the aircraft launched from the ENTERPRISE was the F4 Phantom. This versatile aircraft served as fighter/bomber as well as photo and electronic surveillance. The two-man aircraft was extremely fast (Mach 2), and had a long range (900 - 2300 miles). The F4 was also very maneuverable and handled well at all altitudes. Most pilots considered it one of the "hottest" planes around.

Cdr. Edgar A. Rawsthorne was the pilot of an F4 which flew from the air wing onboard the ENTERPRISE, and on December 29, 1965, he was assigned a combat mission which would take him through the Mu Gia Pass into Laos. His bombardier/navigator on the aircraft that day was Lt. Arthur S. Hill, Jr.

The Mu Gia Pass was one of several passageways through the mountainous border of Vietnam and Laos. U.S. aircraft flew through them regularly, and many were lost. The return ratio of men lost in and around the passes is far lower than that of those men lost in more populous areas, even though both were shot down by the same enemy and the same weapons. This is partly due to the extremely rugged terrain and resulting difficulty in recovery.

Just west of the pass, Rawsthorne's aircraft was hit by enemy fire and crashed. It was not believed that either of the men onboard survived the crash of the plane. Both were declared Killed in Action, Body Not Recovered.

Rawsthorne and Hill are two of nearly 600 Americans who are missing in Laos. Unlike in Vietnam, no negotiations were held with the communist Pathet Lao to achieve the release of prisoners held in Laos. As a result, not one American held by the Lao was ever released.

Tragically, over 10,000 reports concerning Americans prisoner, missing or unaccounted for in Southeast Asia have been received by the U.S. since the end of the war. Experts say that the evidence is overwhelming that Americans were left behind in enemy hands.

A part of Nogales International history died Thursday with the passing of Craig White Pottinger.

Pottinger and the Nogales International co-celebrated their 80th birthday on May 25.

It was on that date in 1925 that his father Craig Pottigner published the first edition of the newspaper.

At the bottom of Page One of that edition the senior Pottinger announced the birth of his son. The headline read, "A new newspaper and a new boy," announcing that "Master Craig Pottinger Jr., came into the world at 2:55 a.m." the same day.

"The youngster made his debut into the vale of printer's ink at the exact time The International went to press which necessitated a short delay in this premier issue of the paper," he said.

On Thursday, Pottinger died in his home in green valley surrounded by family members.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 57 years, Lorelee E.
