CHAPTER 663.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Paradise.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealta of Kentucky:

Boundary.

.7 6 3 . . .

§ 1. That the town of Paradise, in Muhlenburg county, is hereby established and incorporated, with the lots and streets, alleys and land in the following boundary, to-wit: Beginning on Green river, at the mouth of the ravine, below said town; running thence with Green river, and up the same, with, and including Water street, to the southeast corner of lot No. 6, Brank's survey; thence with R. A. Alexander's line to a stone south-west corner of same lot; thence with said line to the south-west corner of lot No. 2, of said survey; thence with Alexander's line to the south-west corner of said lot; thence with Main

street to the north-west corner of lot No. 3, of said survey; thence across Main street with Alexander's line to a stone north-west corner of lot No. 1, Storm's survey; thence with said line to a stone south-west corner of lot No. 4, old survey; thence with Alexander's line to the bank of the ravine; thence down and with the meanders of the ravine to the beginning.

§ 2. That J. B. Bowland, and Nat Wise, are hereby appointed judges of the first election of Trustees for said town, who after having taken an oath impartially to discharge their duty, shall on the first Saturday in April, 1856, after having given three days notice, proceed to the election of five Trustees of said town: Provided, That if said election is not then held, they may hold said election at any time during the year 1856.

§ 3. That after the first election, the general laws as applicable to towns in this State, shall apply to the town of Paradise; and said Trustees shall hold their office until the next election under the general law and until their successors are qualified.

General town laws to be applicable.

§ 4. That said Trustees shall have full power after having obtained the consent of the owners of the lots or land in said town, to open any other streets or alleys, and to have the plot of said town recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County Court of Muhlenburg county.

Power to open new streets and alleys.

§ 5. This act shall take effect from its passage.
