CHAPTER 187.

AN ACT to establish the town of Rochester, in Butler county.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Town boundary.

§ 1. That the town of Rochester, in Butler county, Kentucky, as laid off and described in the following boundary: Beginning at the point where Green and Muddy rivers unite; running thence up Green river to the dividing line between the land of H. B. Wiggins and J. J. Cannon, formerly W. S. McDowells; thence up the Russell-ville road, with said line, to the line between the lands of said Wiggins and J. B. Phillips; thence with that line to the back part of said Phillips lot; thence a westerly course to the lake or slough back of said town; thence with said lake to Muddy river; thence with said Muddy river to the beginning, shall be known and the same is hereby declared to be the extent and limits of said town of Rochester.

Act to incorporate Morgantown made part of this act. § 2. That the provisions of an act, entitled, an act to authorize the town of Morgantown, in Butler county, to elect a Police Judge and town Marshal, approved March 10, 1856, so far as the same authorizes the creation and establishment of the offices of Police Judge and town Marshal in said town, be and the same are bereby made applicable to the town of Rochester, hereby established.

§ 3. That the same officers shall be elected at the same time that County Judges and Sheriffs are elected, in the same manner, and for the same tenor, possess the same jurisdiction, be subject to the same liabilities, and entitled to the same compensation, as is provided in the act creating the same officers in the said town of Morgantown, above referred to.
