

In the name of God Amen I John Hartison of the County of Muhlenburg and State of Kentucky Being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do therefore make ordain publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament That is to say first after all my lawful debts debts are paid and discharged the residue of my estate real and personal I give and bequeath and dispose of as follows I wit to my beloved wife Mary Elizabeth Hartison the land and appurtenances thereon said farm lying East of Grandville Muhlenburg County State of Kentucky likewise make constitute and appoint M. H. Utley to be my Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills By me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this twenty first day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand and eight hundred and fifty seven John Hartison

The above written instrument was subscribed by the said John Hartison in our presence and acknowledged by him to each of us and he at the same time published and declared the above instrument to be his last will and testament and we at the instant requested and in his presence have signed our names as witnesses hereto and written opposite our names our respective places of residence
