

I Benjamin W. Bundiff being of sound in mind do make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking any and all former wills made by me

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary S. Bundiff all of my property both Real personal and mixed to be held by her during her Natural life

Second After the death of my wife I desire all my property (except the Land hereinafter mentioned) be divided equally between my son Jefferson D. Bundiff and my daughter Mary S. Bundiff (I have heretofore given my other children some property which I desire to be in lieu of their part of my estate

Third After the death of my wife I give to my son Jefferson D. Bundiff the tract of land on which I now live but I desire that my daughter Mary S. Bundiff have a home on it as long as she lives

Fourth I hereby appoint my son Jefferson D. Bundiff my executor of this my last will and Testament
