to make her equal with my Other Children after a horse  
I have all ready given her

Third I will and desire that after all my debts are paid  
that the balance of my estate be Equally divided be  
ween my Children

Fourth I hereby appoint my Son Samuel Brown my Executor  
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking  
all Other wills heretofore made
