Jonathon Groves's Will.  
Kentucky, Muhlenberg County.  
In the name of God, Amen: -

I Jonathon Groves of the aforesaid state and County being weak in body but of a sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, I do make and publish this, my last will and testament in the manner and form following, that is to say first- I give and bequeath to my well beloved sons, Isaac, Charles and William all my lands and tenements and to my well beloved wife, Edy Groves, all the rest of my movable estate, goods and chattles of what kind soever they be; I give and bequeath the same to my well beloved wife during her widowhood and at the day of her marriage she is to receive but a child's part. I likewise appoint William Weir, David Groves & Edy Groves my well beloved wife executors and executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 20th day of March in the year of our Lord 1811.
