 State and County considering the uncertainty of this Mortal
 life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory
 Blessed be almighty God for the same. I do make and publish
 this my last will and Testament in manner and form
 following (that is to say). I give and bequeath unto my
 beloved wife Peggy all and singular my lands and tenements
 and all the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate
 goods and chattles of what kind and nature soever I give and
 bequeath the same to my sa^d beloved wife during her
 widow hood and no longer but at the day of her Marriage
 she sh^o have a childs part and I do hereby appoint my sa^d
 wife sole executrix of this my last will and Testament
 hereby revoking all other former wills by me made
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal the second day of February in the Year of our Lord
 One thousand eight hundred twenty One
