14th I will that this said farm shall bee subjected
to a Mortgage on file in the Office in Greenville
Muhlenburg County and State of Kentucky, there is
a Note given by Jonathan Kittinger, deceased, given
to me Martin Kittinger that is now in the hands of
Wickliffe and Johnson Atty's at Greenville, the above
County and State herein named, Said Note shall be
Collected and paid on Said Mortgage on Said farm,

6th All personal property, Household and Kitchen furniture
I will that my wife Mary E. Kittinger have and
to hold as she sees proper to dispose of for any
case of necessity during her life.

7th I will that all my Claims and accounts now
due me shall bee placed in the hands of my wife
Mary E. Kittinger for collection and for her disposal
as she sees proper.
