

I Elizabeth J. Myers, being sound of mind and capable of attending to business, do for the purpose of doing justice to all parties concerned, make this my last will and testament,

- 1st That my just debts be paid.
- 2nd That my son Bernard G. pay to my son David H. five dollars and to my son Phillip E. ten dollars and to my daughter Mattie Heck ten dollars, this money being due me on a note now held by me against Bernard G.
- 3^d That my son Bernard G. have the balance due me on the note referred to above after paying David H. \$5. to Phillip \$10. and to Mattie Heck \$10.00.
- 4th That to my son David H. \$5. to be paid to him by Bernard G.
- 5th That to my son Phillip E. \$10. to be paid to him by Bernard G.
- 6th To my daughter (Mattie Heck) \$5. to be paid to her by Bernard G.
- 7th to my daughter Mary Madora McGee during her natural life a certain house & lot in Belaver Dam, Ohio County Ky. being part of a lot or parcel of land deeded to me by W. M. Taylor and wife, after the death of my daughter Mary Madora McGee, I will that this house and lot be sold and equally divided between my legal heirs. Also to Mary Madora McGee in her own right and for her own benefit to do as she may see proper to do with, to have and to hold to her and her heirs and assigns forever a certain house & lot in the town of Rockport Ohio County, Ky. being the same deeded to me by Solomon Decker known as town platt as part of lot No. 9. Also, I further will that Mary Madora McGee have all my household & kitchen furniture that I may have at my death. My reason for giving to Mary Madora McGee the greater share of my estate, is that she has taken care of me in sickness and old age, also that the money with which the property was bought was allowed by the courts for my own and her maintenance

I further will that Mary Madona McGee
be appointed without bond as my executrix,
