being of sound mind and memory do hereby  
declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby  
revoking and making void all former wills by  
me at any time heretofore made.

1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath to my wife Louisa  
Overhults all right, title and interest that I have  
in one seven year old bay horse mule, one two  
year old black mare mule, one two horse wagon and  
set of harness, one cow and calf and seven head of  
hogs. The above property was given to Louisa Over-  
hults by her son Robert Hill deceased. Also all  
right title and interest that I have in one black  
mare eight years old, and one clay bank mare mule  
six years old, and one cow and calf, and two huffers,  
one three years old and the other is one year old,  
and eleven head of hogs. Also all the household  
and kitchen furniture.

2<sup>nd</sup> The residue of my property, both real and  
personal, will go to my legal heirs as the law directs.  
3<sup>rd</sup> I hereby appoint Daniel A. Hill as Executor  
of this my last will and testament.
