Will

The last will and Testament of Lewis Reno of Mullinburg county Kentucky -

I Lewis Reno considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory (Pleas be almighty God for the same) do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manners and form following (that is to say) First I will that all my just debts as shall be by me owing at my death together with my funeral expenses and all charges touching this my will shall in the first place be fully paid and satisfied and after payment thereof then my will is that all the residue of my farm Goods Stock Chattels and household furniture shall be sold at public Vendue or in such manner and at such time and on such terms as my Executors shall think best - And the proceeds thereof shall be divided into four equal parts One equal fourth part thereof I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth James - One equal fourth part thereof I will and bequeath to Daughter Nancy K. Lovelace - one fourth part thereof I will and bequeath unto my Daughter Fanny L. Finch - One equal fourth part thereof I give and bequeath unto and among my Grand Daughters Sally A. Kinchloe Mary E. Kinchloe Hannah T. Kinchloe and Clara L. Kinchloe - The children of my deceased Daughter Clara Kinchloe - to be equally parted and divided among them - Share and Share alike, and to be paid and delivered unto them the said Grand Daughters at their several respective ages of Twenty one years or days of Marriage, which ever shall first happen - and in case ^{any} said Grand Children shall depart this life before such time as the part or portions of his or them shall become payable then and in such case the part of his or them so dying shall go and be equally divided among
