Short or his children, Jacob L. Short (Sarah J. Spurrier & Ephraim Short one share between them) Susan A. Hearbin to have a full share a part from what is willed her above. David J. Short, Jane Carey & Jonathan Short my Brothers & Sister to have no part of my estate as I believe as I believe the Rebellion they are aiding will lessen my estate more than I could give them - my wish is that all my just debts be speedily paid.
