

I, S. A. Webb, being of sound mind, declare this to be, "by the grace of God," my last will and testament, viz: That should I die before my wife Mary E. Ky. consisting of, two mules, Kate and Jack, one cow and calf, ten hogs, one buggy and harness, one breaking plow, and three one horse plows and all farming utensils, also lot of corn and hay, with the exception of one stack of hay, and one hundred bushels of corn, of the present crop, also one lot of furniture as follows, one dresser, one wash stand, one bedstead and feather bed, and bedding for one bed, one rocker chair one arm chair and six chairs, one centre table, one sewing machine, also one mower and hay rake, shall be the property of my wife Mary E. Webb, to have and hold for her life, and at the event of her death the above property here mentioned shall go to my children or their heirs, and be equally divided between them.
