On this 29th day of August 1832, personally
appeared before me Martin Higate a Justice of
the peace for the County aforesaid John Ward
resident in 2^d County Aged eighty two years who
being first duly sworn according to Law doth
in his Oath make the following declaration in
Obedience to obtain the benefit of the provisions made
by the Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832
That he entered in the Army of the United ^{States} or
State troops, (as he was not previously questioned
which) in the year 1776 as well as he recollects
for three years with Capt. William Field and
served in the 2nd Virginia Regiment, under the
following named Officers — That he entered
as above stated under Capt. William Field in
the County of Culpeper State of Virginia
and was attached to the 2nd Regiment command-
ed by Col. John Spotswood in the line of the state
of Virginia, that soon after his enlistment he
was made a recruiting sergeant & continued
in that service until he was ordered to Bal-
timore in the state of Maryland & from thence
to the state of Pennsylvania, for Culpeper
Co. where he resided until he entered he went
through the counties of Fauquier, Prince William
& crossed the Potomac River near Dumfries over
to the state of Maryland, and from thence
through Charles County into the Baltimore & from
thence to Pennsylvania, he was discharged
at

at Winchester, in the fall of 1779, in which service he received an honorable discharge from Capt. Marcus Calamus, which he has lost. He was in no battles, he has no documentary evidence, neither does he know of any body nor of any by whom he can prove his service, but has no doubt but his name can be found on the Continental lists, or state Troops of Virginia as he is not certain in which service he was in.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except this present one. He declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state in the Union. He further declares he is unable to attend court owing to bodily infirmity.

I Martin Hugate a Justice of the Peace for the County Court holden in & for the County of Pendleton State aforesaid where the declaration resides do hereby certify that the above named John Hand is from a disease called the Consumption with which he has been afflicted for some time, he is unable to attend the Court in which I am a Justice of the Peace and I do not think from present appearances he ever will be able to attend this Court.

On this 14th day of March 1839, personally
appeared before me Robert S. Fugate, a Justice of the
Peace in and for the County aforesaid, Jane A. Hand
a resident of Pendleton County, in the State of Kentucky,
aged seventy five years, who being first duly sworn, ac-
cording to Law, doth on her oath, make the following
Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the
provision, made by the act of Congress, passed July
the 7th 1838, entitled an Act, granting half pay
and pensions to certain Widows. That she is the
Widow of John Hand, who was a Soldier in the
Revolution, and for his services as such obtained a
certificate of pension, before his death, under
the act of June the 7th 1838, and for proof
of the rank he held in the Army, and the
services he performed, reference is requested to be
had to his Declaration, and the Testimony
accompanying the same now on file in the
Office of the War Department. She further
declares that she was married to the said John
Hand, on the day of _____ in the year
seventeen hundred and eighty six, that her
Husband the aforesaid John Hand, died on the
8th day of January 1833, that she was not mar-
ried to him, prior to his leaving the service
but the marriage took place, previous to the
first of January seventeen hundred and ninety
four, at the time above stated. her
