On this 15 day of June 1878 before the
County Court of Pendleton County
apprehended love aged 65 years resident in said
County and state of who being first duly
sworn according to law doth on his oath make
the following declaration in order to obtain the
provision made by an act of Congress entitled
an act to provide for certain persons engaged
in the land and naval service of the United
States in the revolutionary war -

That he the said Charles Love entered the service
of the United States as a substitute in the room
of Mean Smallwood in Capt. Thomas Perry's
Company of the 8th Virginia Regiment commanded
by Col. Mowman and in Genl. Charles
Scott's Brigade he entered the service ^{some time}
in March in the year of 1777 at Philadelphia and was
discharged at Valley Forge on the 5 day of
March 1778 and was in the battle of Germantown
and at Brandywine and for
his reduced circumstances needs the assistance
of his Country for support
sworn to subscribed and ^{Love} Charles
declared in open Court this June 15th
1878

Dear Sir:

As requested by Mr. H. W. Jencks of this city, you are furnished herein the record of Charles Love, as found in papers on file in pension claim, S. 38048, based upon his service in the War of the Revolution.

The date and place of birth of Charles Love were not shown, nor were the names of his parents stated.

Charles Love enlisted in Philadelphia, sometime in March, 1777, and served as a private in Captain Thomas Berry's company in Colonel Bowman's Eighth Virginia regiment; he was in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown, and was discharged March 5, 1778 at Valley Forge.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 15, 1818, at which time he was sixty-five years of age, and a resident of Pendleton County, Kentucky.

The papers on file in this claim contain no reference to the family of Charles Love.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, name and address of the person paid, and possibly the date of death of this pensioner, you

should apply to The Comptroller General, General Accounting
Office, Records Division, Washington, D. C., and furnish
