

Abandoned Railroad Corridor Inventory Project Acknowledgements

This research was funded by House Bill 221, signed in 2000. This legislation established the Kentucky Rail Trail Development Office and commissioned research into Kentucky's abandoned railroad resources. The Kentucky Department of Local Government commissioned the Kentucky Transportation Center at the University of Kentucky to inventory the abandoned rail network and assess the lines for trail potential.
