**Circuit Court Is Now In Session**

Circuit court convened Monday morning for the criminal term and a heavy docket to dispose of. Matt Wilson, operating car while intoxicated, \$100 and revocation of driver's license.

Bill Roark, breach of peace, 1 cent;

Orville Patton, drunkenness, \$10;

Dock Ross, setting out fire, \$25;

Ross Russell, breach of the peace, \$25;

Henry Messer, breach of the peace, \$10;

Ora Bowen, pointing pistol, \$50;

Veryl Robinson, destroying public property, \$10;

Herb Stallard and Willis Kiser, gaming, \$20;

Warnie Buckner, drunkenness, \$10.
