Lining up for tickets at the Clark theater on a Saturday in 1948. If you were under 12 you could watch the two movies over and over all day for 15 cents. If your age was above 12 it was going to set you back a quarter. A box of popcorn -one dime.

Next door was the Gray theater. The Gray was smaller and older than the Clark.

Hanging from the marquee is a Billboard for an upcoming stage show featuring the Dixie Ramblers.



Stage shows (these days known as concerts) were performances by well known radio artists of the day. Grayson and Olive Hill as well as countless other small venues played host to these constant touring - usually country music groups -like the Flatt and Scruggs show in Grayson in 1958. During the height of her fame I recall movie theater owner B.W. Clark boasting that Patsy Cline had played at the Clark a few years before.
